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HON'BLE LT. GOV OF DELHI AND HON'BLE CM OF DELHI INAUGURATE SADBHAVANA PARK, AN 11-ACRE DDA PARK ALONG THE WALLED CITY ON MG ROAD ON JUNE 10, 2025



- Hon'ble Lt. Governor, along with Hon'ble CM, inaugurated Sadbhavana Park, an 11-acre DDA park along the Walled City on Mahatma Gandhi Road.
- The second in a series of three parks being redeveloped along the ramparts of the Walled City – this park will offer much-needed recreational green space in Delhi, especially the Daryaganj-Old Delhi areas.
- Key features include Chariot fountains, Baradari, Sculpture fountains, Formal lawns, Shaded eating plaza, and other public facilities.
- Aims to enrich Delhi's landscape and heritage.

Hon'ble Lt. Governor of Delhi, Shri Vinai Kumar Saxena, along with Hon'ble Chief Minister, Smt. Rekha Gupta inaugurated the redeveloped Sadbhavana Park – a grand addition to Delhi's green urban spaces on 10th June 2025.

Hon'ble area MP, Chandni Chowk, Shri Praveen Khandelwal, Chief Secretary, Delhi, and other senior officers from DDA were also present on the occasion.

Parallel to the Walled City, on the Mahatma Gandhi Marg (Ring Road), Sadbhavana Park is spread over 11 acres of redeveloped green area. Intended to emphasize geometrical forms and designed as a formal garden to balance the gardens in the Samadhi complex, on the east side of the Ring Road, this will provide much-needed open recreational avenues in Delhi, especially to the people of Daryaganj and Old Delhi areas. The key features of the park are the Chariot fountains, Baradari, Sculpture fountains, Formal lawns, Shaded eating plaza, and other public facilities.



Personally supervised by the Hon'ble Lt. Governor of Delhi, the Park has white marble pathways and sculptures contrasting beautifully with the linear green areas divided into lawns and low-maintenance plantation zones, which provide a sense of grandeur. Its majestic design makes it the first-of-its-kind park in the National Capital.



A clock tower, currently under construction, will further enhance the park's aesthetic appeal. Additionally, a food van proposed to be operationalized near the parking, will attract visitors and enhance their overall experience.

During the inaugural event, Hon'ble Lt. Governor and Hon'ble Chief Minister jointly planted a Mousari tree in the centre of the Baradari. Other officers planted Pride of India saplings along the designed pathways. The plantation of these trees and saplings will not only enhance the natural beauty of the area but also contribute to improved air quality and ecological balance for the benefit of the community.

White balloons were released into the sky as a symbol of Sadbhavana. The sculpture of five white horses driven by a Sarathi, set in a circular water pond with fountains, adorns the park as a unique feature in Delhi's landscape. Additionally, four magnificent sculptures of Yakshinis, crafted by Padma Vibhushan sculptor Shri Sudarshan Sahoo, are installed within the linear lawns. These artworks enhance the park's beauty and offer welcoming, serene spaces for people to relax.

Under the consistent guidance of Hon'ble Lt. Governor of Delhi Shri Vinai Kumar Saxena, Sadbhavana Park was conceptualized as part of a scheme to decongest Kartavya Path lawns. It is a part of a larger landscape redevelopment project comprising three parks along Mahatma Gandhi Road. The project aims to become a vibrant urban hub where visitors can immerse themselves in nature while enjoying the amenities of a well-maintained park.





Kranti Udyan, the first park in the series, was inaugurated in January this year, and Sadbhavna Park is the second, opened just five months later. The scheme integrates a green belt spread over a 35-acre area, running around 1.7 km in length along the ring road.

Under the leadership of the Hon'ble Lt. Governor, DDA has undertaken various redevelopment and beautification projects across the city to preserve its heritage and increase green spaces, providing the public with more avenues for recreation and cultural experiences.

DDA CELEBRATES 11TH INTERNATIONAL DAY OF YOGA AT 39 LOCATIONS ACROSS DELHI



Marking the 11th anniversary of the International Day of Yoga, the Delhi Development Authority (DDA) organized widespread yoga sessions across the city at 39 locations and witnessed enthusiastic participation from over 35,000 people at its sports facilities and green spaces on 21st June 2025. This year's theme, 'Yoga for One Earth, One Health', aligns yoga with sustainability and global well-being.

- Baansera - Delhi's first Bamboo Theme Park, is now a model project of restoration and rejuvenation of a C&D wasteland on the Yamuna floodplains
- Over 35,000 people came together to perform Yoga sessions at DDA venues across the city

Hon'ble Lt. Governor of Delhi and Chairman, DDA, Shri Vinai Kumar Saxena, led the yoga session at Baansera, a 37-acre bamboo-themed park, developed under his supervision as a model project for the restoration and rejuvenation of a C&D waste site on the Yamuna floodplains. The group of over 2000 yoga enthusiasts performed the asanas simultaneously alongside Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi's live telecast via Visakhapatnam to set a world record under the Yoga Sangam program.

Hon'ble Lt. Governor was joined by Shri N. Saravana Kumar, Vice Chairman, DDA, along with para military forces, CRPF, BSF, CISF, Delhi Police officers, Malaysian delegates under Yoga Bandhan program and senior officials from DDA.

On December 11, 2014, the United Nations General Assembly declared June 21 as the International Day of Yoga. The declaration came at the behest of Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi during his address to the UN General Assembly on September 27, 2014, wherein he stated: "Yoga is an invaluable gift of India's ancient tradition. It embodies unity of mind and body, thought and action; restraint and fulfilment; harmony between man and nature; a holistic approach towards health and well-being. It is not about exercise but to discover the sense of oneness with yourself, the world and nature".



In addition to Baansera, yoga events were simultaneously held at DDA sports facilities, including Siri Fort Sports Complex, Saket Sports Complex, Vasant Kunj Sports Complex, Hari Nagar Sports Complex, Roshanara Club, Paschim Vihar Sports Complex, Dwarka Sports Complex (Sector 11 & 17), Yamuna Sports Complex, Commonwealth Games Village, Chilla Sports Complex, Netaji Subhash Sports Complex, DDA Lake View Golf Course (Bhalswa) and others. At the Yamuna Sports Complex, a special session was organized for differently-abled children, offering them an inclusive platform to engage in health and well-being activities.

DDA parks and greens across the city, like Coronation Park (Burari), Swarn Jayanti Park (Rohini), Hauz Khas Park, Ashoka Garden (Ashok Vihar), Smriti Park (Mayur Vihar, Phase -3), DDA Park (Opp. LSR College, GK-1), Heritage DDA Park (Tughlakabad), Vasant Vatika Park and many others also hosted yoga sessions that saw enthusiastic participation from people of all ages and communities.



Specialized yoga instructors from various groups conducted the sessions, which included breathing exercises, guided meditation, and asanas aimed at improving physical endurance, flexibility, and emotional balance. Through such initiatives, DDA promotes yoga not merely as a physical activity but as a holistic lifestyle that supports preventive healthcare, mental well-being, and social harmony, reinforcing its commitment to a healthier, more mindful community.

Every year, on the International Day of Yoga, DDA recognizes yoga's transformative power by encouraging individuals, communities, and organizations to participate in yoga activities being organized in its sports complexes and DDA public parks across Delhi. By holding public yoga sessions and workshops led by specialized trainers, to meditation gatherings, DDA aims to create awareness about 'Fit India' and inspire people to embrace yoga as a means of promoting their overall health, wellness and happiness.
